PARISH NURSE **NOVEMBER**

We should always be thankful for being blessed by God, but this month we are reminded of Thanksgiving and again to be thankful for everything. Have a great

heart of Gratitude!!

Our Health News for November:

- 1. November is Diabetes Eye Disease Awareness Month. Diabetes is the leading cause of blindness in working age Americans. It is caused by changes in blood vessels in the retina; in some cases blood vessels were swollen and in other cases new blood vessels grew on the surface of the retina. Take medications as ordered and consume a healthy diet, get plenty of exercise, and keep scheduled appointments with your physician.
- 2. November is National Osteoporosis Awareness Month. This month is to bring attention to the importance of building strong bones. Osteoporosis occurs as a person ages. Other risk factors include family history, inadequate intake of calcium and vitamin D, and an inactive lifestyle. Osteoporosis is a silent disease—to check how your bones are doing, ask your doctor to order a bone density test for you.
- 3. November is Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month. This disease accounts for 60-70% of dementia cases; it is a chronic neurodegenerative disease that starts slowly and then gets progressively worse. The most common symptom is memory loss which includes being disoriented and confused, problems managing finances, getting lost, difficulty with household chores and personal care (bathing), changes in sleep patterns, being withdrawn, forgetful of personal and family history, and forgetful of address and phone number. www.alz.org
- 4. November is Epilepsy Awareness Month. Epilepsy is a brain condition which causes seizures. A seizure is a disruption of the electrical communication between neurons in the brain. A diagnosis is confirmed by an electroencephalogram and echoencephalogram. Worldwide 65 million have some type of epilepsy, 3 million in the United States. When a person has a seizure; stay with the person

until the seizure is over, stay calm and get a sense of how long the seizure lasted, prevent any harm, keep the person comfortable, don't hold the person down or put anything in his/her mouth, check his/her breathing and call 911 if the breathing is affected.

Blood Pressure Checks will be given when needed.
