IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH

January 30, 2024

In Philippians 2:1-2, St. Paul writes about being united in Christ and being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit, and of one mind. There is incredible power when the Immanuel fellowship of faith is on the same page, such as when we united as a congregation to build the Fuller Avenue church and the bell tower. We are now called to unite around a shared set of ministry growth priorities during 2024. Tim Vogel pointed out that we are now in the post-pandemic period, that we need to recognize that everything has changed, and that we need to adapt to those changes. At the January 28 congregational conversation, those participating shared the following commitments to action during 2024:

Reinvent the total Sunday morning experience, including welcome, sharing, worship, and fellowship hour. Members want to return some of the practices of the past such as sharing the peace, and also favor a planned sharing time prior to the beginning of worship to make announcements, celebrate birthdays and anniversaries, etc. It was recognized that the Sunday morning experience must be uplifted in parallel to growing our ministries beyond Sunday morning, including greater uses of our digital capability (accommodate those who do not want to travel in the evening and those who are working).

There was enthusiasm for beginning a new year-around ministry for low-income families, perhaps with a focus on single moms or single parents. This could build on our current ministry with Brookside Elementary School and could also include the Eastwood Elementary School in Big Rapids.

There was full support for the 2024 ministry events and programs planned by the Ministry Leadership Network (MLN) such as the annual Dump and Run ministry and the celebration of the 150th anniversary of the founding of the first Lutheran Church in the Big Rapids area and the 80th anniversary of Immanuel Lutheran Church.

The need for ministry leadership development (identifying the next generation of leaders) was recognized. Suggestions were made for improving the way leaders and volunteers are recruited and their roles clarified.

The members appreciate the importance of the ongoing work of Lee Wolken, Phyllis Lindsey, and the Pastoral Leadership Circle in providing pastoral and congregational care leadership. Pastor John Brown suggested that many churches are, in the postpandemic era, thriving without a full-time pastor.

Members appreciate the work of the Property Committee and the contributions of the Marliss Myran Memorial Fund (replace main door, new storage shed, upgrade of the narthex, etc.) and would like to see further plans for the keeping Immanuel's facility up to date (such as the roof replacement and equipment upgrades).

The members are enthusiastic about continuing to explore partnerships with United Church and St.

Paul's Lutheran in Reed City and continuing to develop Immanuel as a community cultural and educational resource.

Members know it is important to explore alternatives for the long-term future of Immanuel, including seeing a feasible plan for paying off the debt on the building (provide us with a vision of Immanuel after the debt is paid).

Other actions discussed were reinventing the marketing and community identity program and the member communications program (Messenger, digital, phone, other).

PARISH NURSE FEBRUARY

February is our month to have the Festival of the Arts with programs and activities scheduled for every day. Check out the booklet to see what you may desire to participate in.

February is our Heart Healthy Month.

Heart Attack Warning Signs:

Chest discomfort. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.

Discomfort in other areas of the upper body. Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.

Shortness of breath. Can occur with or without chest discomfort.

Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness. If you or someone you're with has one or more of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately. Get to the hospital! Patient—do not drive yourself.

Cardio vascular disease is the number 1 cause of death for both men and women. Heart disease takes more lives of women than any type of cancer, chronic respiratory disease, Alzheimer's and accidents combined (420,000 vs. 39,500 a year). Chest pain or pressure is a common symptom of a heart attack in both men and women, some women don't have this symptom; instead they may have fatigue, shortness of breath, a pounding heartbeat, nausea, and/or pain in the jaw, neck, shoulder, back, or ear. If you have these symptoms or an overpowering feeling of anxiety, call "911".

Be good to your heart: Avoid smoking, keep your blood pressure 120/80 or less, keep your cholesterol levels in a desirable range, diet and exercise can improve your levels, check your blood sugar levels, eat a healthy diet, cut back on sodium, control your weight, stay active, if you drink—no more than 2 for men, 1 for women daily.

Symptoms when the heart is weakened:

Fatigue
Limited activities
Chest congestion
Edema (ankle swelling) and
Shortness of breath.
