

The wintery days have been milder for February. Come and worship with us and enjoy the soup & bread meals on Wednesdays at 5:45 p.m. started on Feb 21st with Lenten Service at 7pm. March suppers will be on March 6th, 13th, and 20th. Easter is March 31st

Health news for March will include:

- 1. Traumatic Brain Injury Awareness Month. Traumatic brain injury occurs when an external mechanical force causes brain dysfunction such as a severe blow to the head or a bullet wound. Mild symptoms can occur immediately or days or weeks after the traumatic event. Possible symptoms include loss of consciousness, confusion or disorientation, loss of memory or concentration, headache, nausea and vomiting, loss of balance, mood swings, and sleep disturbances. It's best to have a physician examine a person who has had a recent head trauma.
- 2. Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. Colon cancer is cancer of the large intestine, whereas rectal cancer is cancer of the last several inches of the colon—together they are called colorectal cancers. Most cases of colorectal cancer start as harmless clumps of cells or polyps which later can become cancerous. This is why colonoscopy is recommended—to check for polyps and remove them before they can become colon cancer. When was your last colonoscopy?
- 3. Multiple Sclerosis Awareness Month. Multiple Sclerosis (MS) is a nervous system disease that affects the brain and spinal cord by damaging the myelin sheath (material covering and protecting nerve cells). This damage can include visual disturbances, muscle weakness, balance and coordination problems, sensations such as numbness or "pins and needles", and thinking and memory problems. It may be an autoimmune disease, where the immune system mistakenly attacks healthy cells in the body. MS occurs more in women than men. There is no cure, but medication, physical and occupational therapy can help to control some of the symptoms.
- 4. Intellectual Disability (Mental Retardation)
 Month. This is a disorder which appears early
 in life; it includes a component relating to men
 tal functioning and also a component relating
 to being able to function in one's own environ
 ment. There may be delays or difficulties

- in oral and social skills, problem—Solving skills, and self-help ability.
- Possible causes include genetics, fetal alcohol syndrome, problems during pregnancy, lack of oxygen at birth, exposure to infectious disease or to toxins (lead and/or mercury), and iodine deficiency.
- 5. When one visits his/her health care provider, one's VITAL SIGNS will be checked; they include temperature, blood pressure, heart rate (pulse), respiratory rate, and now the 5 th vital sign, PAIN (which is usually rated on a scale of 1 to 10, one being the least and 10 the most). Vital signs can vary with age, weight, gender, and overall health. Blood oxygenation saturation may also be monitored.

Blood Pressure checks will be as needed.



- February 2024 Progress Report: Vision Committee and Ministry
 Leadership Network

The Vision Committee has prepared an updated worksheet on 2024 ministry growth plans based on input from the congregation at the recent congregational conversation. Plans include the redesign of the total Sunday morning experience, including a new "sharing time" prior to the beginning of worship services to introduce a new "pass the peace" minute, recognize birthdays and anniversaries, and make announcements. There is interest in expanding support for an expanded spiritual discipline ministry including bible study, prayer, service to others, and hospitality. Also being explored is a new community-based ministry in partnership with other organizations, perhaps as an expansion of our current partnerships with Brookside Elementary School, Starburst, and Manna Pantry.

The Anniversary Celebration Team (ACT) has been formed and is being led by Carol Zimmerman and Ron Decker. ACT is planning events this year to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the founding of the first Lutheran church in the Big Rapids area, and to celebrate in 2025 the 80th anniversary of the merger of three churches to form Immanuel Lutheran Church.

Immanuel hosted eleven events during the Festival of the Arts, most of which featured musical performances. Such events indicate that Immanuel is becoming a valued cultural and educational center in the community.

The Ministry Leadership Network is sponsoring a number of ministry programs and events during the winter and spring months. The January 27 chili cookoff was a great success with almost one-half of the participants joining us from St.

Paul's Lutheran Church in Reed City. A workshop on advanced directives was held on January 20 thanks to Bonnie Biers' lead ership. Other ministries planned include bible studies, the re start of Dinner 6s (rather than Dinner 8s), a men's coffee gath ering, a program for widows or singles, and the continuation of the monthly potluck dinners (after Easter).
